#### **Unsupervised Students**

There is a beautiful playground just near the Woodcroft entrance to our school. Parents have informed me that a number of our students go to this playground after school and play there unsupervised for 30 minutes or so before they are collected by parents at about 3:30pm. Concerns for the safety of these children have been expressed to me and I share these concerns. Some of the students are very young and should not be left in a park unsupervised. This area is known to be a regular dumping ground for glass bottles, broken glass and used syringes among other unsafe things that have very frequently been left on the ground there. There is also the possibility of 'strangers' entering this area knowing that there are unsupervised young children there.

I ask that children are collected promptly by parents at 3pm. Please do not tell children to play at the park until they are collected, as this puts them into a very unsafe situation. Even if they are supervised by older siblings, they are still at risk. I thank you for your cooperation with this serious matter. As always, the safety and wellbeing of our beautiful children is our highest priority.

#### **Supervision of Students in the Playground Before School**

We have a teacher on playground duty every morning from 8:30am under the COLA area and the area surrounding the sandpit. We would very much appreciate all students and parents staying in this area in the mornings before school starts to ensure that close supervision of all students is able to be managed effectively. Unfortunately games with large balls (soccer balls, basketballs and footballs) cannot be used in this area. This is for safety reasons. Games using large balls can be played at recess and lunch when the netball court and field areas are open and fully supervised by staff. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding with this matter.

#### **Blacktown Music Festival**

I was very happy to be able to attend the Blacktown Music Festival Concert last term on Wednesday evening, 11<sup>th</sup> September at Bowman Hall. Our Senior Choir and Junior Dance Group were fantastic and performed beautifully. I felt so proud of them all. Well done to all the students who performed on the night and thank you Mr Butterfield, Mrs Mitchell and Miss Fowler for helping our students achieve such a high level of skill in music and dance.

#### **Complaints, Concerns and Issues**

Occasionally parents or members of our school community may be concerned about an incident or issue or may have a complaint they would like addressed.

A complaint can simply be an expression of dissatisfaction or it can be a problem that you want fixed. Sometimes things do not go the way you expect. Sometimes the decisions made or the actions taken need to be explained better. At other times, we need to look more closely at what we did or how we are doing our work.

The DET has a policy to assist in the dealing of complaints. The policy aims to:

- encourage the resolution of problems by informal means wherever possible
- ensure that concerns are dealt with quickly, fully and fairly
- maintain good working relationships between all people involved with the school
- provide effective responses and appropriate redress
- be confidential
- be unbiased

#### How to make a complaint

- Discuss your concerns with a member of our staff or make an appointment to discuss the matter with the Principal
- You may bring a friend or relative to support you.
- If a complaint cannot be resolved in an informal way, you may be asked to put your complaint in writing.
- It is important that your written complaint includes specific details of the situation/issue and an indication of what you would like to happen as a result of your complaint.
- We can assist you to put your complaint in writing, if you require it.

#### What can you expect?

- Most complaints can be resolved quickly and informally to everybody's satisfaction simply by talking to the person concerned or the Principal.
- Some complaints are covered under another policy or by special legislation e.g. OH&S or antidiscrimination policies. You will be advised if this is the case with your complaint. You will also be told how and by whom your concerns will be addressed.
- Occasionally more serious or complex complaints require investigation. These can take a longer time to resolve. If this happens, you should be informed of the progress and outcome of your complaint by phone or in writing at regular intervals until the matter is resolved.
- If you have not heard from the person handling the complaint within a reasonable time, call to ask them what is happening.

#### What are the possible outcomes?

- 1. Your complaint is upheld (in part or in full) and, where appropriate, one or more of the following actions may be offered to you:
- action to remedy or amend the situation
- an apology
- an explanation
- an admission that the situation could have been handled differently or better
- · an assurance that the event complained of will not recur
- an explanation of the steps that have been taken to ensure that it will not happen again
- an undertaking to review our policies in light of the complaint.
- 2. Your complaint is not upheld. The reasons for this should be clearly given.

If you are not happy with the outcome, you may request a review of your complaint.

I encourage all parents or member of our school community who have a concern or an issue to approach a member of staff or myself so that matters can be resolved as quickly and effectively as possible.
